AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP TRIALS.

The final of the South Australian amateur billiard championship trials was won by F. Stevens, at the Palace Billiard Hall, Rundle street, on Friday night. The scores were:-F. Stevens, 500; M. J. Hanley, 326. The best breaks were:-Stevens, 32, 27, 35, 40; Hanley, 24, 25, 26, 30, 26.

Spectators witnessed a good game, although there were no large breaks. Stevens's success was largely due to the fact that he never missed an opportunity. Both players have been nominated for the amateur championships, which will commence on Monday evening, when Stevens will meet H. Goldsmith.

THE AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP.

The first game of the semi-finals of the amateur championship took place at the Palace Billiard Hall last night. Buchanan met Stephens. The latter was the first to find touch, and soon established a lead of over 100. Buchanan caught his opponent after a display of good billiards, the scores being 234 all. At 357, Stephen was 70 in the lead. Stephens reached 400 with Buchanan at 325. The balls ran in Stephens's favor, and he took every advantage of this and played up to his best form. Buchanan did not display his best form. Stephens reached 600 when his opponent was 456. From this on the result was never in doubt. Stephens tunning to his points. The final scores were:-Stephens, 650: Buchanan, 460.

This puts Stephens in the final. He will play the winner of the game to-night between Hearnden and Hanley. The principal breaks last night were:-Stephens, 29, 65, 22, 22, 21, 48, 31, 27, 31, 41, 49, and 30; Puchanan, 21, 31, 29, 36, 31, 21 and 21.

Hearnden in Form.

The final game, 1,300 up, for the State smateur pilliards championship was begun at the Palace Billiards Hall on Wednesday night, between A. H. Hearnden (champton in 1926) and F. K. Stephens. There was a large attendance. Mr. C. T. Fisher was the umpire, and the secretary (Mr. G. F. Steinthal) was in charge of the proceedings. Hearnden was quickly into touch, and he achieved his initial century when Stephens had scored 64. When Hearnden was 158, he held a lead of 70, and with a useful break of 43, he was 163 ahead of his opponent. At 253, he was exactly 100 in advance, and at the completion of his third century he had gained five additional points. The scores later were 384 to 260, and Hearnden then ran to 404 with a break of 31. Stephens failed everal times on long losers. Hearnden ran to 404 with a splendidly compiled 64. and passed the fifth century while Stephens stood at 319. Hearnden made breaks of 35, 29, and 28, and advanced to 599, having a lead of 221 at that stage of the proceedings. When Hearnden passed the 600 mark, Stephens was 372, and at 400 he was 290 in arrears. He then improved, however, and the scores stood at 400 he was 290 in arrears. The winner of the championship will go to Sydney to represent South Australia in the Australian billiards championship next month. The game will be continued to night. Hearnden's best breaks were 35, 34, 43, 21, 39, 32, 20, 23, 64, 33, 26, 49, 33, and 31 (unfinished); while Stephens replied with 67, 31, 25, 21, and 20.

HEARNDEN WINS CHAMPIONSHIP.

A. H. Hearnden had little difficulty in winning the amateur championship of the State last night, after leading on Wednesday night by 245 in the final of 1,509 up, against F. Stevens. The match was played at the Palace Billiard Hall, Rundlestreet. With his score at 750, Hearnden went on his best style, although he had a bad patch at 1.200. He showed improvement all round on his form of 1926, when he previously won the State championship, his losing hazard game being particularly good. His breaks last eight were 69, 45, 39, 42, 42, and 43, and Stevens scored 39, 42, and 37. The scores were:-Hearnden, 1.500: Stevens, 1,080. At the end of the game the president

Is He Lucky?




Snooker Championship to M. Hanley

STEVENS NEW AMATEUR SNOOKER CHAMPION

For five years in succession F. K. Stevens was runner-up in the State amateur snooker championship to M. J. Hanley. This year Hanley turned pro-fessional, and did not compete in the

amateur championship, which Stevens won last night for the first time. Stevens had to play H. C. Goldsmith in the final of five sets up. Stevens played better than his opponent in practically every phase of the game to win by 287 points to 247. It was an interesting same, and Stevens gained a popular victory.

Goldsmith and Stevens have also had some hard matches in amateur billiards. Stevens having been runner-up to Goldsmith for the State title.

Achieves Life Ambition

TN winning the Snooker Amateur Championship of South Australia, Frank Stevens achieved an ambition for which he has striven for many years. Five times in succession he has been runner-up in these contests, but in the recent championship he played better than ever in beating the State's amateur billiard champion, H. L. Goldsmith. As Frank has been runner-up in the Amateur Billiards final for three years, he has been a consistent seeker after titles. In other phases of sport he has done well, having played football for West Adelaide for many years, and he is also a fair cricketer. He has been a keen supporter of coursing and racing, and is one of the few that has made these expensive hobbies pay for themselves.

One of the best horses he raised was Dartmoor, and in connection with this particular performer, Frank Stevens went for the biggest betting coup in his State. In connection with a race at Gawler, £1,000 was invested on Dartmoor, the money being placed all over the State, and not a penny of it got back to the course, with the result that had Dartmoor won, a dividend of over £40 would have been returned. However, Dartmoor was not equal to the job, and so the bookmakers were saved, of a sever headache. Frank won some good races with Mobah and St. Just, but once they had shown him a profit, he let them go into other hands.

Billiards in Adelaide has no keener supporter than Mr. S. J. Jacobs, who has again been felected president of the association.
